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Methods

 - Based on Surgeon General's Report
- Web based, February 2008
- 'Viral' Sampling (convenience)
- Baseline, Repeat periodically
- Focus on providers, broadly defined
 - Populations served, service setting, providers
 - Allowed multiple responses

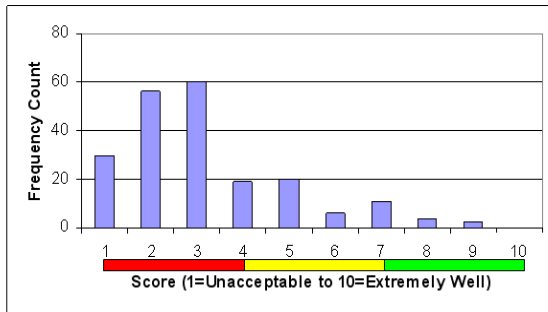

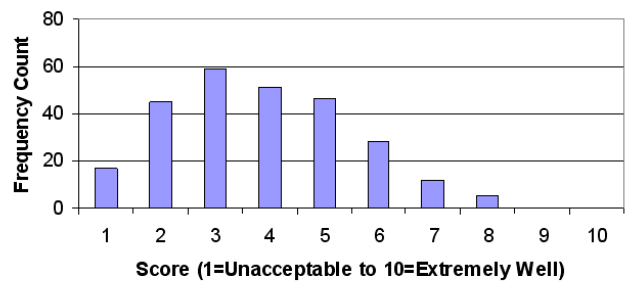

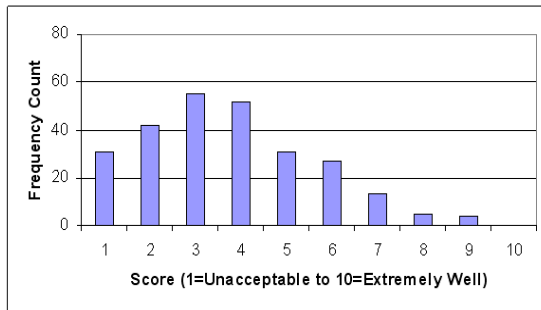

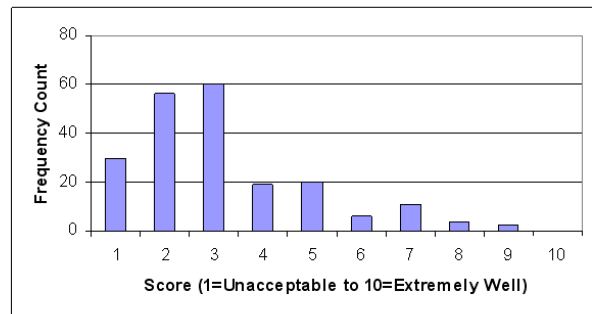

Q5 Educate people that mental illness is common and affects many families? N=263, Mean=3.84



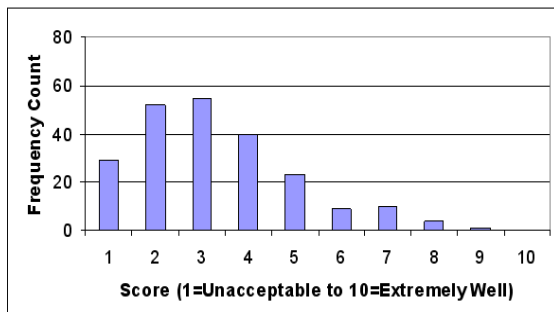

Q7 Include mental health as a normal part of health care for children and youth? N=260, Mean=3.74



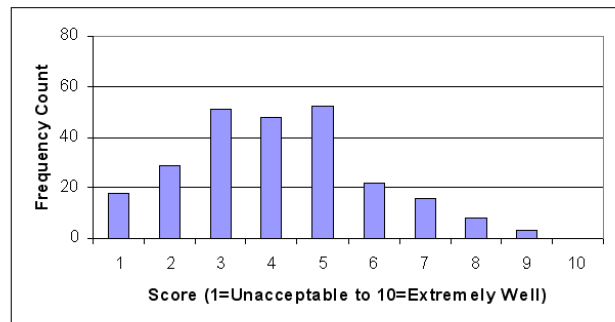

Q9a Identify mental health needs in children aged 0-3? N=208, Mean=3.18



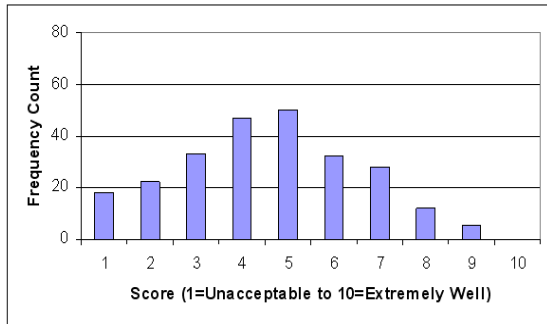

Q9b Identify mental health needs in Pre-K children? N=223, Mean= 3.31



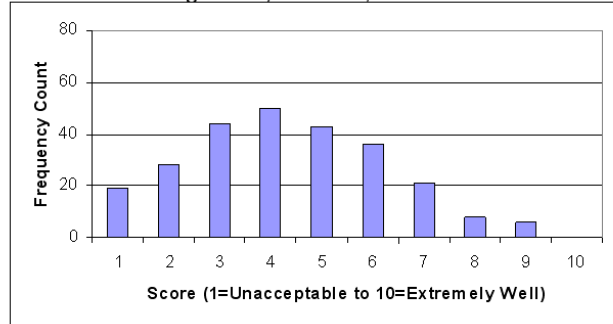

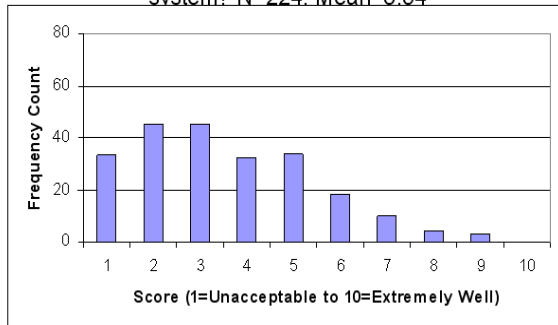

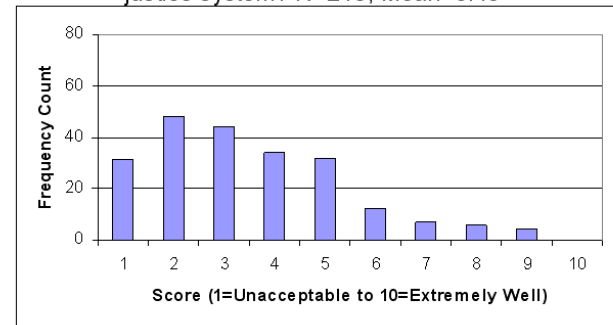

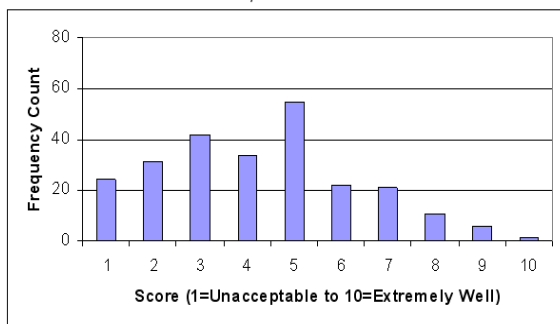

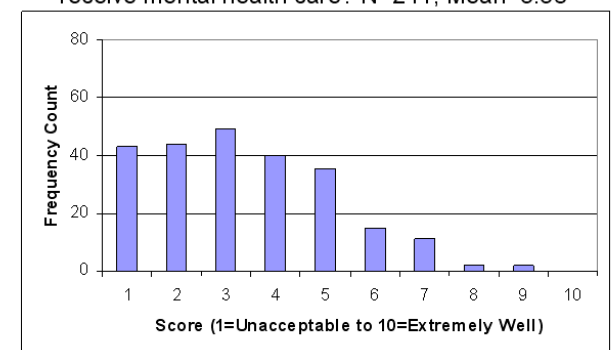

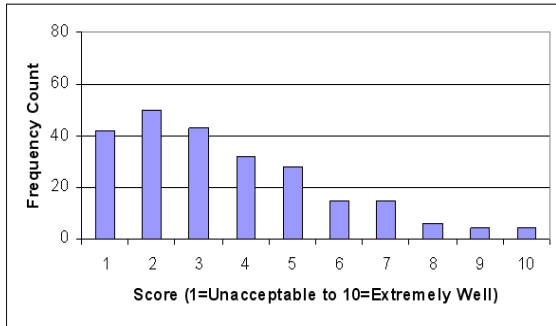

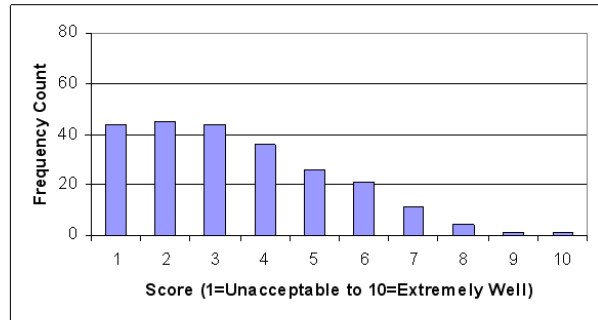

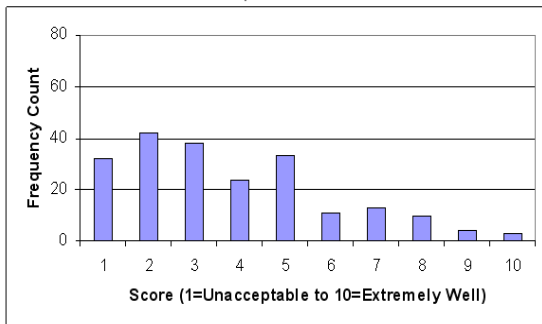

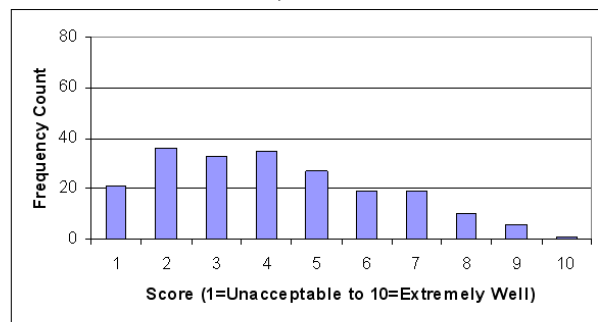

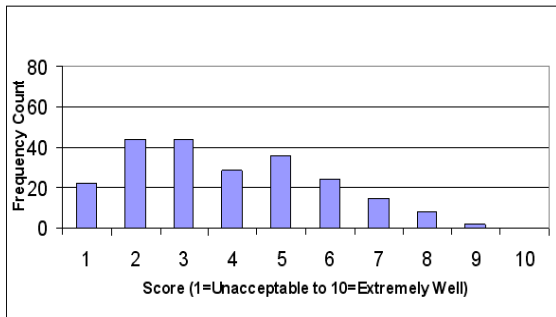

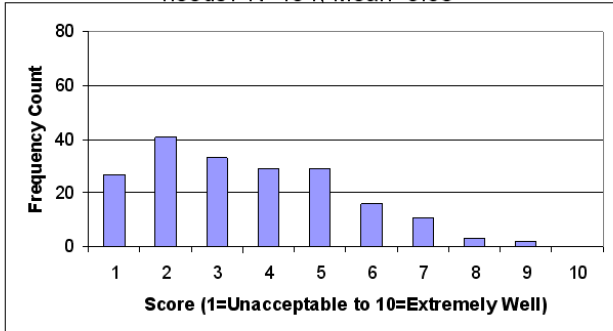

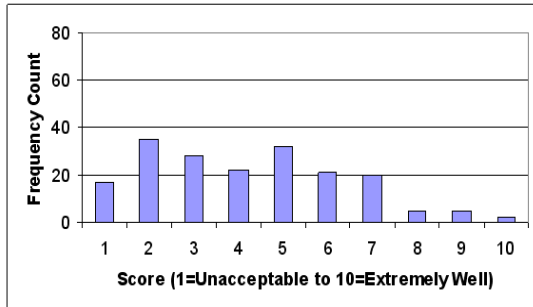

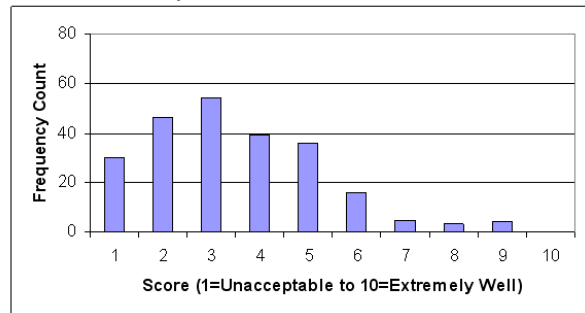

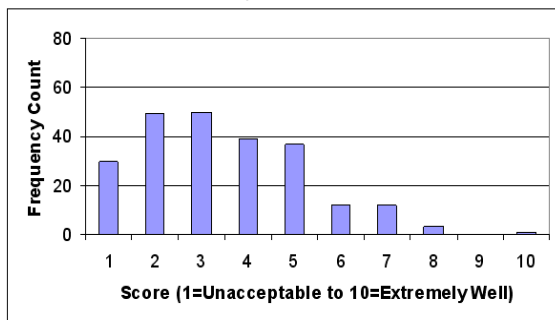

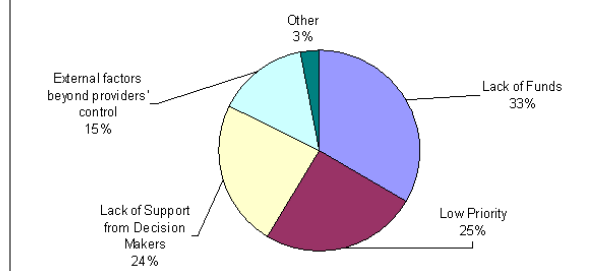

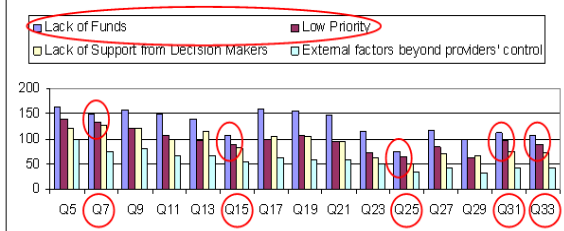

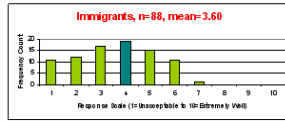

Funding Need v. Low Priority

- Include mental health as a normal part of health care for children and youth
- Make it easy to find information about mental health services for children and youth
- Make receiving mental health care a comfortable experience given diverse personal backgrounds
- Prepare and support adults (e.g., parents, teachers) to recognize mental health issues
- Educate adults (e.g., parents, teachers) to respond to mental health issues
